The United Nations Sustainable Development Goal 3 (SDG 3) focuses on "Good Health and Wellbeing," with the objective of ensuring healthy lives and promoting well-being for all at all ages by 2030. Santosh Deemed to be University is a prominent private university located in Ghaziabad, Uttar Pradesh, India. It was established under Section 3 of the University Grants Commission (UGC) Act, 1956. The university offers a range of undergraduate, postgraduate, and doctoral programs in various fields such as engineering, management, law, medical sciences, and more.

Key Highlights:

Village adoption and its activities

Santosh deemed to be University has adopted 5 villages- Morta, Girdharpur Sunarsi, Basanthpur Sainthli, Matiyala Rajapur and Mehmoodpur Loni. The total population of all these villages together is approximately 1 lakh. Santosh deemed to be University has been catering to the health-related requirements of all these villages through regular community health check-up camps as well as community health awareness camps. In the year 2023, 4 camps per village have been organised and the community members have been screened for noncommunicable diseases, reproductive health issues and other common infectious diseases. Medicines are provided to the people in these camps and those needing referral are provided transport facilities for Santosh Hospital and subsidised care at the hospital.

Apart from it, activities under Santosh Poshan Yojana involving distribution of pulses and cereals are carried out to underprivileged residents of the villages. Distribution of stationary items to school children, sensitisation programs for menstrual hygiene and safe drinking water are carried out regularly under the ISR initiatives of the University- Santosh Swachch Naari Swasth Naari and Santosh Swachch Payjal Yojana. Approximately 500 sanitary pads have been distributed to underprivileged adolescent girls in these villages. 500 families have been provided with chlorine tablet bottles under Santosh Clean Drinking water initiative. Santosh Nirjalikaran Roktham Yojana (Santosh Prevention of Dehydration Scheme) is another scheme in which community members of these adopted villages are sensitised towards prevention of dehydration due to extreme heat or diarrhoea. Awareness sessions are done by students in adopted villages regarding dehydration, its signs and symptoms, and its treatment. ORS reconstitution has been demonstrated to about 500 community members and 500 ORS packets have been distributed to the attendees of the program.

In one of the adopted villages, 100 bundles of copies and pencil boxes were also distributed to the identified school students from underprivileged section of the community. Regular health educational camps involving environmental sanitation and reduction of mosquito breeding sites are undertaken. Tree plantation drives have also been carried out in the area with involvement of undergraduate students.



Family adoption programme and its activities

Family Adoption Programme has been implemented by Santosh Deemed to be University as part of MBBS curriculum from 2021-22 Batch. Till now, three batches have been allocated families in three villages as follows-

- 1. MBBS 2021-22-- Morta
- 2. MBBS 2022-23-- Duhai
- 3. MBBS 2023-24-- Kannauja

Each of the students has been allotted 3 families and the FAP visits are held as per the guidelines. In the 1st year, the students take the demographic data of the families and build rapport with the family members. They ask about their general health and if any health issue is identified, they in consultation with their mentors, advise the family members for visiting the Santosh Hospital. A transport is arranged for such families requiring consultation in the hospital. Each year, the students also mobilise their family members in each of the allocated batches to attend the health camps organised in the three villages. The undergraduate students also perform a thorough general examination of the available family members including anthropometry for children and infants and record it in their logbooks. They also record the details of any investigations carried out in their adopted families through camps. All these empower the student to make a diagnosis of medical conditions in the family members of the adopted families. The students through this program also sensitise the families towards general environment and sanitation measures to keep their surrounding clean and free from vectors. They have during their visits also taught the family members about how to do a digital transaction through UPI.

The students have also carried out plantation drives in these villages in coordination with the community leaders and with participation of the family members.

A total of 12 visits were carried out during the year 2023 in the three batches. In all, 1350 families have been covered by the MBBS students in the three batches.



Satellite Centre and its activities

The Dept of Community Medicine has collaborated with two primary health centres at Bamheta and Duhai respectively. These health centres are government centres and are providing primary health care to the catered community. Rotational postings of interns are done at these centres as part of their training for at least two weeks or more. Undergraduate students and interns perform awareness activities as part of extension activities on these centres. Regular field visits of 2nd year MBBS students are carried out to orient them towards the functioning of these centres and also to help them understand working in a healthcare team.

PRIMARY HEALTH CENTRE- DUHAI

Duhai is located at Meerut Road in Ghaziabad. It has a Primary Health Centre which comes under CHC Dasna.

STUDENT EXCHANGE AGREEMENT Between UNIVERSITA' DEGLI STUDI G. D'ANNUNZIO DI CHIETI PESCARA (Italy) And SANTOSH DEEMED TO BE UNIVERSITY (India)

Università "G. d'Annunzio" di Chieti-Pescara (UdA), whose registered office is located at Via dei Vestini n. 31 - 66100 Chieti, Italy, legally represented by its Rector, Prof. Sergio Caputi and **Santosh deemed to be University ("Santosh University")**, located at No.1, Santosh Nagar, Pratap Vihar, Ghaziabad, Uttar Pradesh 201009 India, legally represented by its Dean – Academics, Dr Shalabh Gupta, considering the development of cultural and scientific cooperation to be of mutual advantage to both Universities, and aiming at reinforcing such cooperation, agree upon the following points:

GENERAL PRINCIPLES

This Agreement is made between UdA and Santosh University with the aim of:

- 1. facilitating reciprocal student exchanges
- 2. enhancing student curricula through study experiences abroad
- 3. regulating the procedures of such exchanges in accordance with the conditions indicated below.

PROCEDURES FOR STUDENT EXCHANGE

- Art. 1: The above-mentioned institutions will select from their own students those, whom they deem suitable to take part in the study abroad programme according to pre-determined criteria.
- Art. 2: The duration of the exchange should not be shorter than two months nor exceed one academic year. The duration of the exchange, as well as the conditions under which it is proposed, will be agreed upon according to the parties' needs and requests.
- Art. 3: Both institutions will keep a reasonable balance in the number of students exchanged. All the details of the student exchange are defined in the Annex A.

APPLICATION, REGISTRATION AND ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS

- Art. 4: Selection of candidates will be made by the home institution. Exchange students will be in good academic standing. Exchange students must be currently registered at the home institution at the time of application.
- Art. 5: Any exchange student whose first language is not the one of the host institutions will be required to demonstrate he/she has sufficient language proficiency to fulfil the host institution's admissions requirements.
- Art. 6: The host institution has the right to decline to accept, or to withdraw from the programme at any time, exchange students it determines are not in good academic standing. The host institution will advise the home institution of any such withdrawal from the programme.





- Art. 7: Neither the home institution nor the host institution will exclude students from participation in the exchange on the grounds of age, disability, gender, race, religion/belief, marital status or sexual orientation.
- Art. 8: Exchange students from the home institution will complete any required application and registration forms of the host institution. Both institutions will send all the necessary forms and information to the home institution well in advance and will notify the home institution of the progress of the exchange students' application and registration materials.
- Art. 9: Exchange students at the host institution will have an advisor who will serve as their primary point of contact.
- Art. 10: Exchange students will be enrolled in appropriate level courses at the host institution, on a full-time basis.

ATTENDANCE OF FOREIGN STUDENTS AT THE HOST INSTITUTION

- Art. 11: At the host institution, students will be allowed to do the following:
 - a) attend classes and take respective exams at the end of the course
 - b) pursue research activities aimed at the production of a dissertation
- Art. 12: The study abroad periods shall be part of the student's home institution degree programme.
- Art. 13: Activities carried out during the exchange period will be approved by the competent authorities that will establish in advance which modules belonging to the student's degree programme can be taken abroad, specifying, if possible, the name of the host institution equivalent module. The attended courses will be recorded as part of the student's academic career, according to the current regulations of the home institution. At the end of the exchange period, the host institution will issue a Transcript of Record specifying the activities carried out and which will have to be sent directly to the
- Art. 14: Exchange students at the host institution will have all the rights and privileges enjoyed by other students on that campus.
- Art. 15: Exchange students are expected to maintain full-time enrolment and to follow the academic regulations, codes of conduct, policies and procedures of the host institution while participating in the exchange programme. Each party reserves the right to withdraw from its facilities any student whose conduct or work is not in accordance with the policies and procedures of the institution or is detrimental to others or who has been found to have violated the law of the host country.

TUITION FEES AND ANCILLARY EXPENSES

Art. 16: Tuition fees will be paid to the home institution; students will benefit from the host institution's services such as libraries, laboratories etc. as regular students.
 Both institutions agree that the following expenses will be the responsibility of the enrolling exchange students: research materials, international and domestic travel, accommodation, food medical insurance and/or medical expenses, insurances covering travel and personal liabilities incurred while





not on the university campus, vacation expenses, books, stationery, clothing, food and all other personal costs, as well as passport and visa costs and all debts incurred during the course of the exchange.

INSURANCE

Art. 17: It is the responsibility of exchange students to ensure that they have health and travel insurance, as well as insurance for their personal belongings.For the duration of this Agreement, both institutions will maintain appropriate public liability insurance.

EXPIRY DATE

Art. 18: This Agreement may be extended or amended at any time by mutual agreement of the parties unless either of the parties gives notice of termination at least 6 months in advance. This Agreement may be terminated at any time by mutual consent of the parties in writing. Exchange students or faculty actively participating in the programme at the time of termination may continue through to the conclusion of the exchange period in progress at the time of termination under the terms and conditions of this Agreement at the time of the termination.

Specific initiatives may be considered and agreed upon, on a case-to-case basis, including the contributions and obligations of each institution. Each such initiative shall be negotiated between the Parties and have a mutual agreement and shall be formalized by a signed appendix to this MOU.
- 8. **Term**. This MOU is effective for a period of 5 years from the date the MOU is signed by both parties. It may be extended or amended with the written agreement of both parties and may be terminated by either party with 6 (six) months' written notice to the other party. Any notice of termination should be addressed by sending an official email or written communication by post to the points of contact identified in Clause 3.
- 9. This MOU is completed in English and is signed in two (2) originals with one (1) original remaining in possession of each party.



Wagner" of the Ministry of Health of the Russian Federation, represented by the Acting Rector Anna Sergeevna Blagonravova, acting on the basis of the order of the Ministry of Health of the Russian Federation dated 18.11.2022 No. 285pk, the Charter, on the other hand, hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Parties", have concluded this Agreement about the following:

1. Purpose of the Agreement

1.1. The purpose of this Agreement is to establish and develop mutually beneficial cooperation between the Parties in the field of education, science and culture on the basis of equality.

2. Forms and directions of cooperation

2.1. The forms of cooperation in the field of academic and research activities under this Agreement are:

- academic and research cooperation in areas of mutual interest;

- exchange of academic information, scientific information, materials and publications;

- exchange of students and teachers;

- sponsorship of joint seminars, workshops and other scientific events (if the educational institution has the financial capacity). The issues of sponsorship are regulated by separate agreements within the framework of these events.

2.2. The Parties agreed to implement the following issues:

2.2.1. Exchange research ideas, academic resources and scientific information;

2.2.2. Organize joint scientific meetings, congresses, conferences, symposiums, seminars, etc.

2.2.3. Conduct joint research in areas of mutual interest. The conditions for the implementation of joint research activities of the Parties are specified in Annex No. 1 to this Agreement and are of a recommendatory nature.

2.2.4. To carry out student exchange and exchange of teachers, other employees,

without the possibility of providing any academic awards, titles, diplomas. The conditions for the exchange of students are specified in Appendix No. 2 to this Agreement and are of a recommendatory nature.

3. Organization of mutual cooperation

3.1. In addition to this Agreement, the Parties may sign a Program of measures to develop cooperation between the Parties. The Program becomes an integral part of the Agreement after it is signed by the Parties.

3.2. The Parties annually review the implementation of the Agreement and determine additional areas and forms of mutually beneficial cooperation.

4. Financing issues

4.1. This Cooperation Agreement does not provide for financial obligations of the Parties to each other.

4.2. The financial relations of the Parties are agreed upon when organizing specific events and are formalized by contracts in accordance with the laws of both Parties.

5. Conflict resolution

5.1. The Parties shall take measures to resolve conflicts arising from the fulfillment of the terms of this Agreement through negotiations.

6. Confidentiality

6.1. The Parties undertake to maintain the confidentiality of any information received from the other Party under this Agreement and other Agreements concluded on its basis.

6.2. The Parties undertake to maintain the confidentiality of the terms of this Agreement and all information transmitted as confidential information or information that should be considered confidential in nature.

7. Force majeure circumstances

7.1. Neither Party shall be liable for non-performance or improper performance of its obligations under this Agreement if it proves that the non-performance or improper performance arose as a result of force majeure events.

7.2. Upon receiving information about the occurrence of force majeure events, the affected Party undertakes to immediately notify the other Party of the occurrence of such events, provide the other Party with detailed information about such events, as well as a reasonable estimate of the period during which such force majeure events will continue.

7.3. If force majeure events continue for more than 30 (thirty) days, the Parties have the right to terminate this Agreement by submitting a written notice 7 (seven) days before the date of the intended termination.

8. Term of the Agreement and termination rules

8.1. This Agreement shall enter into force upon signature by the Parties and receipt of a positive conclusion of the Ministry of Health of the Russian Federation on the possibility of concluding an Agreement. In case of receiving a negative conclusion of the Ministry of Health of the Russian Federation, the Agreement is considered not concluded.

8.2. The term of this Agreement is 5 (five) years. The specified period may be extended by mutual and written consent of the parties.

8.3. If one of the parties wishes to terminate the Agreement, it must notify the other party in writing no later than 6 (six) months in advance. In this case, current projects will continue until

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completion, and students who continue their studies will complete their studies under this Agreement.

9. Final provisions

9.1. Any changes and additions to this Agreement are made only with the written consent of both parties and are considered an integral part of this Agreement.

9.2. This Agreement is made in 2 (two) copies having the same legal force.

Conditions for joint research activities

1. Proposals for joint research activities under this Agreement may be submitted with the prior approval of the head of each of the Parties or his deputy.

2. Each Party nominates one representative in charge of the joint program. Individual work programs under this Agreement are jointly planned and implemented by representatives of both Parties.

3. The implementation of individual programs will be approved and monitored by the authorized bodies of both Parties.

4. The Parties to the Agreement undertake to act in accordance with the legislation of the Republic of India / Russian Federation and proceed from mutual respect, respect the interests of both Parties, act on the principle of not causing financial, reputational and other damage to each other, protect each Party, as well as officials, managers and employees involved in the partnership of each of the Parties from claims by third parties, if they arise in the course of interaction under this Agreement, regarding property or partnership, except for cases when it is finally established that the claim of a third party arose as a result of or was related to the actions or omissions of one of the Parties or as a result of the actions or omissions of both Parties, as well as any of the officers, managers or employees of each of the Parties, or persons acting in their capacity, what constitutes a violation of this Agreement or any agreement (contract) concluded in addition to this Agreement.

5. In relation to each joint project, an additional agreement (contract) is concluded, which reflects the issues of intellectual property rights, financing scheme, conditions for disclosure of information, etc.

Student exchange conditions

1. Exchange students representing each of the Parties have the right to study, as well as to participate in research activities and project work on the territory of the host Party.

2. Students wishing to apply for participation in the exchange program apply to the appropriate dean's office of the educational institution and provide a package of necessary documents.

3. In order for a student to participate in the program, the consent of the head of the educational institution / project manager / supervisor is required, as well as compliance of the student's candidacy with the conditions of the program.

4. The Sending Party provides the receiving Party with a list of candidates for participation in the program. The host Party reviews the candidates of students and determines their compliance with the requirements of the student exchange program. The sending Party sends candidates for participation in the program after agreement with the receiving Party.

5. Neither Party has the right to require exchange students to pay an entrance fee or other tuition fees.

6. Exchange students representing each of the Parties independently pay the following expenses: travel, accommodation, representative and other exchange-related expenses (including the costs of preparing academic transcripts, medical examination, meeting at the airport, welcome kit, as well as mandatory insurance and other fees in accordance with the legislation of the host party).

7. The sending party is informed by the receiving Party about the academic performance of exchange students by providing the latter with progress reports.

8. Each Party accepts a pre-determined number of students by the Parties. The number of students is approved by the Parties at the beginning of each academic year, based on academic and administrative capabilities.

9. The term of participation in the exchange program is no more than 12 months.

10. Students participating in the program study on the territory of the host Country, in compliance with the requirements of the educational institution established in relation to foreign students.

11. The start period of the exchange program is the beginning of the semester.

12. For exchange students conducting research or developing implementation projects within the framework of a postgraduate education program, the receiving Party undertakes to provide a supervisor who assists in the development of a research project, if there is a topic and concept.

13. The receiving Party undertakes to inform the sending Party about any academic and other problems that arise during the stay of foreign students in the territory of the receiving Party. In case of problems, the Parties jointly take actions to resolve them, in accordance with the established policy and the current legislation of the host party.

14. Applications for participation in the exchange program are accepted during the year. Possible time limits are specified by the Parties in the process of agreeing on the terms of participation in the program.

15. The cost of the exchange program is calculated annually.

16. Within the framework of the exchange program, students can take short-term courses (summer school) lasting from two to four weeks in the spring or summer period. The programs involve organizing visits of students and teachers to the territory of each of the Parties in order

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to study the ecosystem of patient care, the academic environment and the organization of the educational process, technological development and research of the cultural environment and features of nursing care in the host country.

- h) Severance: If any provision of this MOU is invalid, unenforceable or prohibited by law, this MOU shall be considered divisible as to such provision and such provision shall be inoperative and shall not be part of the consideration moving from any Party hereto to the others, and the remainder of this MOU shall be valid, binding and of like effect as though such provision was not included herein.
- i) Entire MOU: This MOU including the annexure thereof constitutes the entire MOU of the Parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and supersedes all negotiations, prior discussions, whether oral or written, related to such subject matter and any prior MOU.
- j) Notices: Every notice, demand or communication to be given under this MOU shall be in writing and shall be deemed to be duly served if sent by registered post or courier or e-mail at the address mentioned herein below in this MOU unless the same have been changed by the concerned Party by intimation to the other Party.

World Down Syndrome Day – 21.03.2023

Preface:

The department of Psychiatry, Santosh Deemed to be University, Ghaziabad, NCR Delhi organised World Down Syndrome Day on 21.03.2023 (Tuesday) at 10:00 AM – 11:00 AM.

Importance of World Down Syndrome Day

Talk based on concept of providing them equality in following areas;

They are not given an excellent education. They do not receive adequate medical attention. They are prevented from working and generating their own income. They aren't permitted to choose how they want to conduct their life. Their cries go unheard!

Down syndrome

An extra chromosome causes the disorder known as Down syndrome. In the body, chromosomes are discrete "packages" of genes. They control how a baby's body develops during pregnancy and after birth, determining how it will look and work. A newborn typically has 46 chromosomes. One of these chromosomes, chromosome 21, has an extra copy in infants with Down syndrome. Trisomy is the medical word for having an extra copy of a chromosome. Trisomy 21 is another term used to describe Down syndrome (DS). The newborn may experience difficulties with their mental and physical development as a result of this additional copy, which alters how their body and brain grow.

People with Down syndrome may appear and act alike, yet each one is have different capbailities.

Prevalence (number of babies have Down syndrome in India)



Every year, between 23,000 and 29,000 children are born in India with Down syndrome.

35 yr is cut off age considered risk factor for having such DS babies is 1 in 250 births.

Down syndrome types

The three different varieties of Down syndrome. The physical characteristics and behaviours of each kind are frequently similar, making it difficult for people to distinguish between them without looking at the chromosomes.

Trisomy 21:

Approximately 95% of Down syndrome sufferers also have Trisomy 21.2 Instead of the typical 2 copies of chromosome 21, each cell in the body in a person with this kind of Down syndrome has 3 copies.

Translocation Down syndrome:

This kind of Down syndrome only makes up about 3% of all cases of the condition. This happens when an extra chromosome 21 is present, but it is not a separate chromosome 21; rather, it is attached or "trans-located" to another chromosome.

Mosaic Down syndrome:

Around 2% of individuals with Down syndrome have mosaic Down syndrome. Mosaic is a term for mixture or combination. Some of the cells in children with mosaic Down syndrome have three copies of chromosome 21, while other cells have the standard two copies. The characteristics of other Down syndrome children may also apply to children with mosaic Down syndrome. Yet, because some (or many) of them have cells with a typical number of chromosomes, they might have fewer symptoms of the illness.

Diagnosis

Screening tests and diagnostic tests are the two main categories of testing available to identify Down syndrome during pregnancy. A screening test can inform the expectant mother and her healthcare practitioner of the likelihood of Down syndrome in the baby. Although screening tests cannot offer a definitive diagnosis, they are safer for the woman and the unborn child.



Diagnostic tests can usually tell whether a baby will have Down syndrome or not, but they can also put the mother and growing infant at greater danger. Nobody can foresee the full effects of Down syndrome on a baby; neither screening nor diagnostic techniques can do so.

Testing Exams

Screening tests frequently combine an ultrasound, which produces a picture of the baby, with a blood test, which counts the quantity of several compounds in the mother's blood (e.g., MS-AFP, Triple Screen, Quad-screen). The fluid behind the baby's neck is one of the things the technician examines during an ultrasound. A genetic issue could be indicated by extra fluid in this area. The results of these screening tests can be used to estimate the baby's Down syndrome risk. Occasionally, screening tests may produce an abnormal result even when the baby is healthy. Even when the test findings are normal, they can still miss a problem.

Detection Tests

When a screening test results in a positive result, diagnostic testing are typically carried out to confirm the diagnosis of Down syndrome. Several diagnostic procedures include:

Chorionic villus sampling (CVS)—looks at placental tissue

Examines the amniotic fluid during amniocentesis (the fluid from the sac surrounding the baby)

Blood from the umbilical cord is examined via percutaneous umbilical blood sampling (PUBS).

These examinations check for chromosomal abnormalities that might point to a diagnosis of Down syndrome.

Additional Health Issues



Numerous individuals with Down syndrome have the typical facial characteristics and no other significant birth abnormalities. Unfortunately, some individuals with Down syndrome may also have a number of serious birth abnormalities or other health issues. The following is a list of some of the most typical health issues that affect kids with Down syndrome. 8

Loss of hearing When a person has obstructed sleep apnea, their breathing will occasionally stop while they are asleep. Infected ears Eye conditions Birth malformations in the heart

Health professionals often check children with Down syndrome for various ailments.

Treatments

Down syndrome is a chronic illness. Early intervention services can frequently assist babies and young children with Down syndrome develop their physical and intellectual capacities. The majority of these programmes are geared towards promoting the full development of kids with Down syndrome. These treatments, which normally come under early intervention programmes in every state, include speech, occupational, and physical therapy. Despite the fact that many of them are integrated in ordinary courses, children with Down syndrome may also require additional support or attention in the classroom.



CME – Mental Healthcare Act 2017 29.03.2023

Preface:

Mental Healthcare Act 2017

Postgraduate (PG) training in psychiatry started in India in 1941 and was regulated by the Medical Council of India starting in 1956. It has since changed into a more organised objective framework. In order to prepare students to become future teachers, trainers, and clinical practitioners, the majority of PG programmes mandate the submission of a dissertation in addition to clinical practise. This is done to provide students experience in organising, carrying out, and distributing research. The Mental Healthcare Act (MHCA) of 2017 requires that the training regulatory board review the curriculum in order to incorporate the requisite information, abilities, and competence of trainees. The Act increases the importance of paperwork and form completion while giving psychiatrists instructions on how to behave in specific circumstances.

Research involving patients with serious mental illness is permitted under particular conditions. The article covers the MHCA provisions that call for changes to the curriculum in order to better prepare psychiatric interns to practise within the confines of the law and to be aware of patient protections when doing research. It is the responsibility of the trainees to take the initiative and make an attempt to comprehend the practical ramifications. The best approach to learn is through mentored practise in their clinical postings. Finally, one must be aware that different people may interpret the act's provisions differently. Any interpretation of the clause is still subject to legal challenge.



Psychiatrists' methods of practise will alter as a result of the 2017 Mental Healthcare Act (MHCA). Changes must be made at the training level as a result for the trainees to be able to practise in accordance with the legislation. While the law permits research with people who have severe mental illnesses, it has also added particular protections for such study.

Differences in the Law

Family members could request the admission of people with mental illness under the previous law, the Mental Health Act (MHA) of 1987. Family members were typically involved during assessments and reviews of progress in any healthcare setting. On the other hand, the MHCA 2017 prioritises the rights and choices of patients. The Act requires documentation and the completion of forms and directs psychiatrists to act in a specific manner in a specific circumstance.

Skills in Communication

Patient and family interaction

There is a need to give PMI and their families enough time, to communicate more openly, to improve trainees' abilities to gauge the patient's comprehension of and competence for various care-related concerns, and to ascertain the individual's preferences for treatment, including the setting. While determining the level of risk and when addressing the legal issues with the patient and family, the trainees must seek supervision and guidance from their supervisors. It is important to be aware of potential conflicts between patient preferences and those of the family.

The trainees may occasionally encounter contradictory circumstances in which they may be required to disclose decisions made to admit patients against their will and in which they may be required to deny to admit a patient at the request of their family in accordance with the law. The first thing to understand is that different circumstances may call for different types of intervention. Second, even when choosing a choice that complies with the law, the choice made may end up making the patient or their family unhappy. Such a circumstance needs to be handled cautiously, and the trainees' mentors must assist them.



Written Correspondence

One must master the art of accurate recording because it could be used as proof in the event of an investigation or medicolegal dispute. Every situation should be viewed as having potential medical legal implications, and proper documentation should always be carefully considered. Any doctor, including PG trainees, may be called by the courts, review boards, or medical councils for clarifications or as a witness. For instance, even if a specific decision to act against someone's will must be recorded in writing, the trainee may be asked to come before the Review Board or Court to defend their reasoning. The trainee must be ready to explain why guidance was not requested or improperly recorded in a specific situation.

Informed Consent

The MHCA 2017's provision, which requires trainees to obtain patients' informed consent even for what may seem like regular care, will transform how practitioners operate. The students would need to practise informing patients and get their permission. It may be necessary for trainees to learn how to have conversations with patients in which, for instance, they present a selection of popular antidepressants along with a description of the typical response and adverse effects. The patient is then urged to make choices that ultimately determine the course of treatment.

The ability to make choices regarding care and treatment

The criteria for determining whether a person has the capacity to make decisions about their mental health care and treatment are outlined in Chapter II. Under supervision, trainees are most suited to implement changes in clinical practise and start evaluating capacity for a particular component. They should record the procedure, the reasoning behind their conclusion, as well as any future plans in which they may highlight the necessity for a capacity reassessment.

Advance Directive

Patients must be treated in line with a legitimate Advance Directive, according to the law (AD). Although the Act has made it the duty of the patients or their Nominated Representative (NR) to make AD documents accessible to the doctor when required, trainees seeing patients for the first time in an emergency setting or the outpatient clinic



will still need to enquire if a person has already obtained one. The act further states that emergency treatment under section 94 may still be provided despite a valid AD in community settings that are not registered as mental health establishments. The trainees must also be aware of the difficulties associated with implementing the AD in our nation.

The Nominated representative

Patients have the option of designating a family member or even a stranger as their NR. When the patient has the capacity, the patient still takes the lead in decision-making despite the existence of NR. The provisions in this section must be understood by trainees, who should also involve the NR as needed.

Right to Information

In accordance with the right to information, patients who are admitted against their will in accordance with a specific provision of the act must be informed of the nature of their illness, the treatments available, the circumstances surrounding their admission, as well as their legal options for appealing to the relevant board. The initiative must come from the trainees, who should practise giving such information and documenting it. Also, it might be viewed as a good practise to provide written information on their type of admission, their rights, including the ability to appeal, and its procedure.

Right to confidentiality

The confidentiality of patient information is emphasised in the code of medical practise. The Act, however, outlines circumstances under which this privilege may be suspended. For instance, the least amount of information required to safeguard the patient from harm or violence to self or others or for public safety will have to be disclosed to concerned parties when a patient with mental illness poses a danger of harm to self or others due to the underlying illness. Moreover, information may need to be made available to courts or other statutory agencies. It is best for trainees to only release information when properly supervised, but they must make an effort to participate so they can learn from actual experience.



Right to access medical records

As patients have access to their medical records, trainees must be aware that the data they include in their notes could be examined or questioned. There may be various methods of documentation. For instance, a more vivid and verbatim narrative could be used in place of interpretations such "the person is threatening suicide." A suitable description of the reported phenomenology can support an opinion that a patient is delusional or lacks insight. There may be difficulties as detailed case notes are increasingly replaced with telegraphic electronic internet documentation.

POLICY ON SMOKING FREE CAMPUS SANTOSH DEEMED TO BE UNIVERSITY, GHAZIABAD, DELHI NCR

The proposal to frame **"POLICY ON SMOKING FREE CAMPUS"** of the Santosh Deemed to be University was considered by the Board of Management in its meeting held on 07.12.2022 and **approved** the the same as under:

- "1. A policy for transforming the Santosh Deemed to be University as a Smoking Free Campus in order to ban tobacco smoking in University and reduce exposure to smoke, harmful health outcomes, reduce smoking prevalence, de-normalize tobacco use, and potentially discourage youth smoking initiation, as under:
 - a) The University has a Tobacco Cessation Unit that is run in the Dental College. The University consistently promotes activities to ensure promotion of smoking free environment in Campus.
 - b) The OBJECTIVE of the policy is to provide a smoking-free, tobacco and other narcotics free environment for all Stakeholders that includes Faculty, Students and Employees. It also ensures all visitors within the University campuses which also covers all the vehicles that enters the premises and facilities such as Cafeteria, Canteen, Play Grounds, GYMs, and Hostels. Several sign Boards are placed in the Campus as an Educative and Informative Campaign towards ensuring the above such as "No Smoking" "Smoking Free Zone" etc. Information regarding the policy has been given to all admitted students and displayed on all Notice Boards.
 - c) Tobacco Cessation is necessary to reduce morbidity and mortality rate related to tobacco use. The Tobacco Cessation Unit is a service run by our University in order to aid persons wishing to quit smoking or other tobacco related habits. The role is to diagnose tobacco use, advise, motivate and help to quit smoking. The University undertakes tobacco Cessation activities in the Tobacco Cessation centre for the

common public in view of offering service to the society at the large.

d) This Policy also ensures restriction of Tobacco usage with in the University campus and any Violation of this policy is a punishable offence with fine and severe action will be taken by the competent authority."

2. Implementation Guidelines:

If any stakeholder/ Visitors/ labourers/ vendors found smoking / consuming tobacco/ drugs in any form within the campus of Santosh deemed to be University including Santosh Hospital and Hostel premises, the same may be immediately informed to the Disciplinary Committee. The Disciplinary Committee shall consider the matter seriously and enquire and initiate appropriate punishment for the violation of the rules of the Santosh Deemed to be University in transforming the University a Smoking/ drug free campus. The Committee shall also ensure that the punishment for violation is implemented truly in the letter & spirit.









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
