CLEAN WATER & SANITATION



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SDG 6 (Clean Water and Sanitation) aims to ensure availability and sustainable management of water and sanitation for all by 2030. Universities, as educational and research institutions, have a key role in advancing this goal, both through their on-campus operations and by engaging in outreach and research.

Santosh University, is involved in to support **Sustainable Development Goal 6 (SDG 6): Clean Water and Sanitation**. These activities generally aim to address water quality, conservation, and access to sanitation, both on-campus and in surrounding communities.

1. Water Conservation Programs:

- **Rainwater Harvesting:** Santosh University has installed rainwater harvesting systems in different parts of the Campus to capture and store rainwater for irrigation or other uses, reducing dependency on external water sources.
- **Water-efficient Infrastructure:** Promoting the use of water-saving devices in bathrooms, kitchens, and labs, including low-flow taps and toilets.

2. Water Quality Monitoring and Awareness:

- **Workshops and Awareness Campaigns:** Santosh University hosts workshops or campaigns to raise awareness about water pollution, conservation methods, and the importance of clean water.
- **Research Projects on Clean Water and Sanitation:** Santosh University engages students and faculty in research projects focused on local water quality, pollutants, and how to improve water safety in nearby areas. There are 4 projects of students of Santosh university published in Scopus Indexed journals.

3. Community Outreach and Engagement:

- **Clean Water Access Projects:** The University has Partnership with local communities to improve access to clean drinking water by organizing several water purification awareness.
- **Sanitation Drives:** Initiating campaigns to promote proper sanitation practices in surrounding areas or schools to prevent waterborne diseases.

4. Eco-friendly Campus Initiatives:

- **Wastewater Recycling System:** University has its own on-campus wastewater recycling plants to treat and reuse water for non-potable purposes like irrigation and flushing.
- **Plastic Reduction:** Encouraging the reduction of single-use plastics that pollute water bodies, and offering alternatives like reusable water bottles. University has declared its campus as a No Plastic Zone.

These activities align with the spirit of SDG 6 by addressing issues related to clean water, sanitation, and sustainable management of water resources. Santosh University play an important role in spreading knowledge and implementing practical solutions, often through student involvement in projects, research, and partnerships.

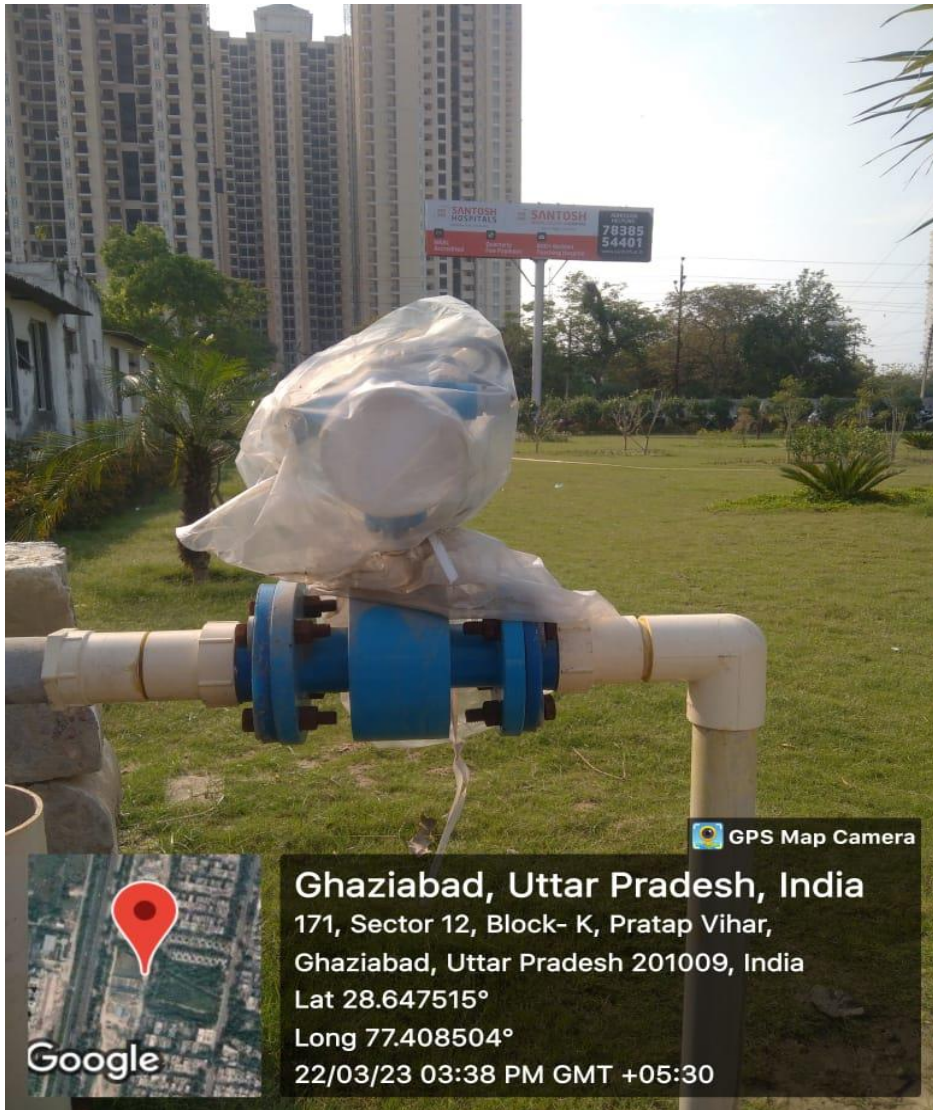

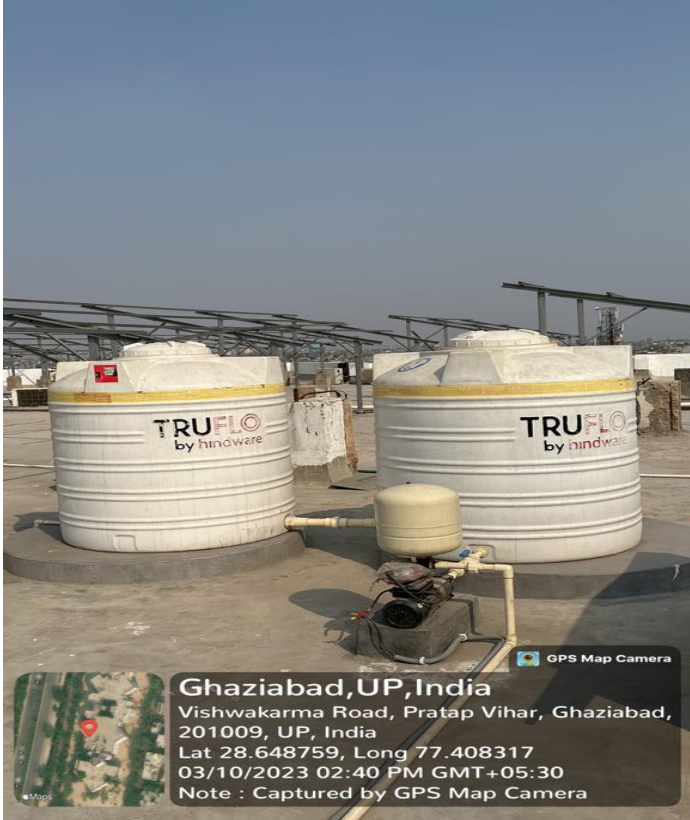

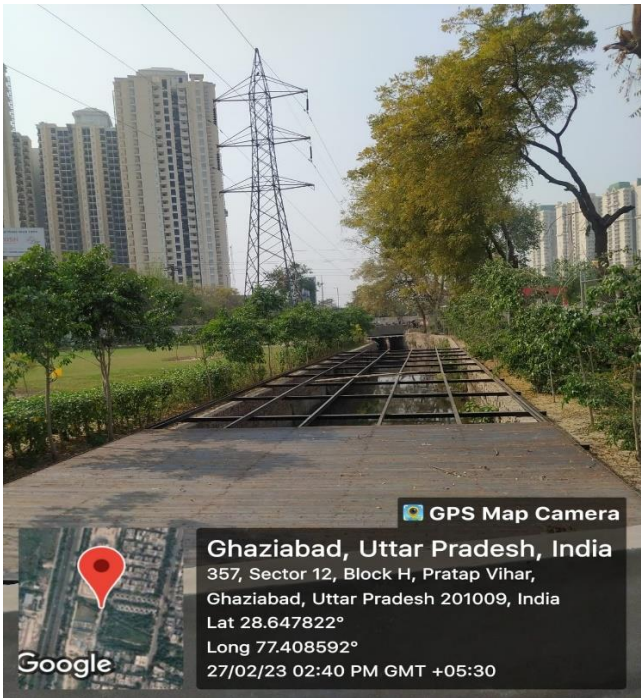

LIMITATIONS:

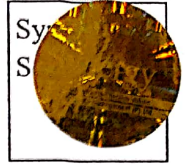
- Compost pit areas could not be designated although agreed upon to work on.

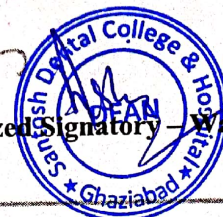
